As part of my input, **Programme Director**, allow me on behalf of the Sedibeng District Municipality to pay tribute to mme Nadine Gordimer who died in her sleep on 13 July 2014.

Her interest in racial and economic inequality in South Africa was shaped in part by her parents. Her father's experience as a refugee in tsarist Russia helped form Gordimer's political identity, but he was neither an activist nor sympathetic toward the experiences of black people under apartheid.

Opposite to her father, mme Gordimer saw activism by her mother, whose concern about the poverty and discrimination faced by black people in South Africa and led her to finnd a day care centre for black children. This shows that not all minority people subscribed to the ideology of apartheid.

Mme Gordimer also witnessed government repression first-hand during her teens; the police raided her family home, confiscating letters and diaries from a servant's room.
